- The pilot project, approved in 2004, began in 2005.
- Music Development Manager and Violin Resource Tutor appointed.
- Instrument Bank.
- Panel of part-time Instrumental and Vocal Tutors.
- Tuition began in various centres around the County.

DMEP Today – A Snapshot



- 3 full-time members of staff Music Development Manager,
 Administrator & Violin Resource Tutor
- 32 core part-time tutors
- 13 Teaching Centres in 10 locations around the County
- 30 weeks tuition per year, 4.30-9pm, Monday to Saturday
- 15 Performing Groups instrumental & choral that rehearse either weekly or bi-weekly
- Approx. 800 students are regular users
- Primary Age Group remains as 7 to 18 years but have started a programme for 4 – 7 yr olds.



DMEP Today – A Snapshot



- 2013-14 Academic Year: 40 concerts & performances directly involving our performing groups & students, 8 in-school workshops, 3 community workshops and 5 chamber music for strings / summer school
- Scholarship Programme
- CPD for Tutors
- On-line registration / payments system & barcoded tagging system for instrument bank
- Rebranding Donegal Music Education Partnership and in early stages of developing our own website, independent of Donegal ETB
- Continue to work in partnership





Fulfilling Expectations

- Being able to protect the core activity, maintain the present momentum an ongoing challenge
- Having raised expectations in the community its challenging to stay at that level with limited budgets and manpower
- There is an expectation from stakeholders to constantly expand regardless of standstill resources
- Difficulty in finding adequate time for Planning and Creative Thinking





Quality Control

- Attracting & keeping quality teachers
- Resistance to embrace CPD opportunities
- Traditional teaching methods VS more creative all- embracing musicmaking and group teaching
- Notion that the tuition is of less value if not accredited or exam focused
- Maintaining standards within the various performing groups
- Lack of human resources / Personnel





Financial Challenges

- Ongoing sustainability raising match funding
- Demand for increased per-hourly tuition rate
- Cost of high quality tuition can be prohibitive to parents therefore deterrent/participation barrier
- Cheaper tuition alternatives being offered by unqualified teachers





Resources

- Human both paid and voluntary
- Adequate office accommodation, rehearsal space, instrument storage etc
- Preservation, maintenance and development of instrument bank





General / Miscellaneous

- Marketing & public profiling is essential but this very much a neglected area due to required time commitment.
- Sheer geographical size of county & spread of tuition centres
- Transport & Supervision



Words of Advice to the new MEPs



- Be MODERATE in your plans and outlook, start from a small base
- Know your limitations Nothing worse that raising expectations in the community but NOT HAVING THE RESOURCES / ABILITY TO DELIVER
- Only grow as you have the resources to do so
- A good information management system is essential
- Implement a Volunteers Programme
- Good Communications and Marketing Strategy to maintain awareness



Words of Advice to the new MEPs



- Continuously meet, inform and educate those people in key positions in your 'Parent' organisation (i.e. ETB or Local Authority) as to what it is that you do.
- Write up an OFFICE MANUAL
- Maintain and nurture a good relationship with Centre Caretakers
- Keep enjoying what you do and have fun!
