Structure

- Weekly lessons for beginner intermediate and advanced classes in guitar, drums and keyboard
- Weekly Jam Time for more advanced musicians and singers
- Classes are small group lessons made up of no more than 3 students
- Students background

Programming

- Informal learning environment where the repertoire is young person led
- Intermediate and advanced classes are sectional rehearsals – supportive environment where the foundations of the repertoire for jam time is developed
- Performance focused

Ethos

- Nurturing yet informal
- Tutors/Teaching Artists as role models
- Young person led
- The physical space/resources and timing of lessons/ jam time are key
- Social element for participants
- Simple Things Hospitality and Friendliness
